Norman Raney Smith was born March 6, 1951 in Orange County, California. He was the son of G. Abbott Smith and Levora Raney. His grandparents were Norman V. Raney, brother of Letha Raney, and Frances Songer, sister of Clark Songer. Over the years Mr. Smith collected photographs, documents, scrapbooks, and various artifacts regarding his great-aunt Letha Raney and Robert B. Taylor to whom he was related by marriage.

The collection includes correspondence, scrapbooks, articles, and photographs about Letha Raney's work during World War II, her teaching career, and work as a principal at Corona Junior High School. The Raney portion of the collection documents the impact that Letha Raney had the community and the development of Corona schools. There are twelve photographs of the Taylor and Mason families from the mid-to-late 1800s. The Taylor images provide early glimpses of Corona's founding father and his family.
