HOW DO I DISPOSE OF MEDICATION PROPERLY?

Liquids

- EMPTY liquid medication onto absorbent paper towels or rags.
- DISPOSE of with regular trash.



Pills

- CRUSH pills.
- DISPOSE of powdered medication with regular trash.



Propellant Inhalers

- EMPTY the container by expelling all propellant.
- DISPOSE of small empty cylinder in the trash.

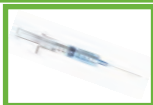

HOW DO I DISPOSE OF USED NEEDLES PROPERLY?

Needles and Lancets

- PLACE used needles, syringes and lancets in a hard sided plastic container, like a bleach or laundry detergent bottle, with a secure lid.
- PLACE A LABEL on the container that says "SHARPS / NEEDLES."
- SECURE the lid and tape the container closed.
- TAKE CONTAINER to a HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE center or collection event.



**SHARPS, NEEDLES, SYRINGES AND LANCETS
MUST BE DISPOSED OF AT A HOUSEHOLD
HAZARDOUS WASTE CENTER
OR COLLECTION EVENT.
DO NOT TAKE THESE ITEMS TO THE
CORONA POLICE DEPARTMENT.**
