Drs. J.C. Gleason (Feb/8/1845-March/27/1908) and **Flora S. Gleason** (March/13/1850-January/17/1910.) received their homeopathic medical degrees from the Medical College of Iowa City, Iowa and later married. In 1887 they came to California, first to Santa Ana and then in December, 1887, to South Riverside where for several years they were the only physicians in the City¹. (info from obituary, Corona Courier, March 28, 1908, copy of which is in the Heritage Room bio file under Gleason)

Their son, **Vesper Avery Gleason**, married **Florence Agnes Newton**, (March 30, 1874-Jan 7, 1954), their children, **Paul R. Gleason** (Feb 10, 1899-April 17, 1970) and **Floy Gleason Clark** (Sept 17, 1895-April 13, 1966) inherited the property on 6th Street, the Drug store and home.

Paul and Floy attended the University of Redlands, Paul became a physicist and later headed the Department of Physics at Colgate University and Floy was a nurse, later a chemist and worked in a bi-products plant.

The account book, the list of patients and their complaints and treatment, plus a scrapbook compiled by the Doctors, of medicines and treatments available, provides extensive information on early medical care at the beginning of the 20th century in Corona.

Correspondence (1899-1899) from **Elmer Fern Gleason** (Sept 14, 1873-Aug 16, 1902) to his mother, Flora S. Gleason gives a soldier's account of the Filipino-American War,

The women in the family kept diaries and scrapbooks, beginning with the diary, 1869, of the mother of Flora Gleason, Mrs. Dexter P. Smith, down to her great-granddaughter, Floy Gleason. Floy's diary provides insight into the life of a teenage girl in 1912 in a small town.
