All new permits <u>must</u> include (2) sets of plans with the following information:

- Site plan with access roadways shown to scale (1":50' recommended); North (direction) Indicator; Map Legend identifying locations, indicators and symbols used on the site plan.
- **Distances** in feet to buildings, building openings, property lines, between piles, containers or tanks shown.
- Location(s): identify all hazardous materials/chemicals on-site and show all storage, in-use and disposal locations.

Identify specific storage devices (i.e. – cabinets, carts, fixed installations, etc.)

For INTERIOR storage and use - show on FLOOR plan

For EXTERIOR storage and use - show on SITE plan; include exterior tanks, cabinets, cages, etc.

If permit application is for the use of hazardous material(s), copies of all MSDS sheets may be required. Contact the Fire Prevention Division.

- Business Emergency Plans may be required and specific fire code permit fees may be waived. Contact the Fire Prevention Division.
- Fire Protection (proposed or provided); extinguishing systems, on-site hydrants, water supplies, fire alarm and detection systems, etc. Required secondary containment (diking) per CFC Chapter 50 or 57
- Signage/Placards must be shown on the Site or Floor plan, per area.
- Knox Rapid Entry System (Knox System lock boxes, storage cabinets, padlocks and electronic override key switches) location(s) as indicated in the guidelines.
